Legal representation	Olathe NEA members have access to experienced education attorneys for job-related incidents, and reduced fees for legal services on issues unrelated to the job	Non-members must pay full attorney fees for any services they require, whether jobrelated or not
Representation in meetings	Olathe NEA members receive assistance from experienced representatives when preparing for evaluative and disciplinary meetings	Non-members must prepare for meetings on their own
Advocacy for students and public schools	Olathe NEA members have full-time advocates at the local, state, and national level lobbying for a pro-student and propublic education agenda	Non-members must try to advocate for themselves
Representation on district committees	Olathe NEA appoints its members to joint Olathe NEA/Olathe School District committees	Non-members have no representation on the committee
